Dewey Cemon Johnson, 91, of Chelsea, Alabama who from his residence went to be with his Lord

and Savior Jesus Christ on Monday, November 20, 2023. Mr. Johnson was more commonly referred

to by most family members and friends as DC or Cemon, but by his grandchildren and great

grandchildren he was Pawpaw.

DC was born on December 6, 1931, in Columbus, Mississippi. He was the son of the late Dewey

William Johnson and the late Trannie Lou Holliman Johnson, both of Lamar County, Alabama.

He is survived by his loving and devoted wife Mildred "Millie" Louise Nunnely Johnson of Chelsea,

Alabama. They were blessed with 47 years of marriage.; his loving and faithful daughter Ouida Gaye

He was a lifelong member of the Methodist Church. He served many years on the Administrative

Board while at Oxford United Methodist. Since living in Chelsea, he and Millie have been faithful

members of the Morningstar Methodist Church. There he served on staff for the Parish Relation

Team Committee and was part of the Men's Group.

DC was a Mason, and man of good and exceptional character. Some traits that would best describe

him would be soft spoken, slow to anger, kind, honest, faithful, dependable, trustworthy, hardworking and a good steward of what God gave him.

Mr. Johnson served proudly in the United States Air Force and was a veteran of the Korean War. As

a radio operator their mission was to fly back and forth from Korean to Japan to air lift the wounded and fallen soldiers, as well as to drop off equipment and supplies.

He was proficient as a telegraph operator in using the Morse Code which he had learned from his

brother. That helped him land a job with the Southern Railway. Mr. Johnson went on to have a long

and rewarding career working for the Southern Railway as a Freight Agent. He started with them

right after graduating from Kennedy High School, but his time was interrupted by his service in the

Air Force. He retired in 1993 after 40 years of service.

He will be greatly missed, but we look forward to the time that we, as part of the body of Christ, will

reunite with him in Glory.
