Dennis was a proud Army veteran and served his country in Operation Desert Storm in 1990 - 1991 as a combat engineer attached to C Company 46th Engineer Battalion. He was honorably discharged after his tour of duty in 1993. After his military career he drove for BR Williams, SuperValu and Davis Oil and also worked for Samco. Most of his career was spent at Noble Signs where he was shop superintendent until the business closed. He ended his working career hauling oversized equipment for Burford Construction. Dennis made many friends during his work career and maintained contact with so many of them. He was known for his ability to fix anything, and never backed down from a challenge.

Dennis was most happy when surrounded by his wife whom he always called his Queen, his children, grandchildren and faithful fur baby.
