Mr. Doyle Eugene Watts, 43 of Munford, Alabama passed away on June 16, 2024.

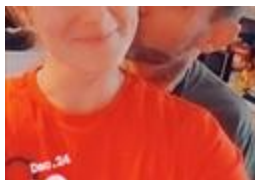
