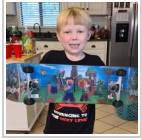

Needless to say we had to take another path back across, no way was she getting back on that bridge. In thinking of things to do somehow June and I talked her into going rafting bless Danny's heart.. They put us in a raft gave each of us paddle and told us what to do, how to do it when we reached the rapids. They said make sure you follow the trail and DO NOT LOSE THE PADDLES. I set in the front then June Jackie and Danny in the rear.
