Jim worked for Alabama Power after college and then went on to start his business, Stewart Engineering in Anniston, which he ran for about 40 years. He worked with local architects, Auburn University and many cities and co-ops throughout the state. Jim was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Anniston. He served on the board at Camp Lee for several years; 2 of those years were spent serving as Chairman of the Board, contributing to the growth and upgrading the infrastructure of the Camp.

Jim had a passion for the family farm in Munford. He enjoyed tending to his gardens and Cows. Jim was a loving and caring son, brother, husband and father. He definitely had the spirit of giving. He took care of his family, friends and so many unnamed people throughout his life. He touched people's lives with his kindness, generosity and his words of wisdom.
