My daddy has always been there for me no matter his geographical location to me. After spending 20 days in coweta county it was my daddy who made the trip from Oklahoma and convinced jail officials I didn't need to be there. And how many folks can say they left jailhouse driving a limousine? I did. That's just on example. There are several times my daddy was there for me. My daddy never met a stranger. And he never acted as though he was better then someone else be it money or appearance. He would talk about the lord with other followers but was more compelled to talk about the lord to long haired bikers or some other roughies. I remember waiting in the car with my mom and sisters for what seemed like an hour sometimes for him to get through congregating with folks after church services before he would finally get in the car to go home. As most of you know my daddy was pretty straight with as kids growing up. A few years ago he tried to apologize to me by saying I know I was rough on you growing up.
