Louise Williams Lokey, 94, passed away peacefully, with her children by her side, on December 25, 2022, in Winchester, Tennessee. She is survived by her children Robert Henry Lokey (Jennifer), Carrie Lokey Mauzy (William), grandchildren Jane Fulton Mauzy, Hampton Field Mauzy (Lani), Joshua Hampton Mauzy (Julia), Matthew Wilds Mauzy (Ally) and great grandchildren Maya Indigo Mauzy and Henry Wilds

Mauzy, her sister Mary Williams Tartt, Livingston, Alabama, brother-in-law Rev. Richard Jones, Alexandria, Virginia, and 12 nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her husband, Dr. Robert Henry Lokey, parents, Dr. Mark Johnson Williams and Effie Mae Fulton Williams. Also preceding her in death were her brothers Mark J. Louise was a native of Oxford, Alabama where she graduated from Oxford High School in 1946. She also received a Master's Degree in counseling from Jacksonville State University in 1977. In addition, she participated in study at Union Theological Seminary at Columbia University, New York, New York, in 1949.

Mrs. Lokey was involved for decades in Anniston and Calhoun county in numerous volunteer and work activities. She served as president of the

Anniston/Calhoun County Historical Society and as president and program director of the Friends of the Anniston/Calhoun County Public Library. She worked with the Anniston Park and Recreation Department for many years, including as chairwoman of the advisory commission from 1992-1995. She was the manager/buyer for the Museum Store at the Anniston Museum of Natural History from 1985- 1999. Other participation included The League of Women Voters,

Alabama Shakespeare Theatre Guild, and the Anniston/Calhoun County Service League. Louise was also engaged in many educational related activities. These include work as adjunct instructor in Child and Human Development for Jacksonville State University, school board member for the Episcopal Day School in Anniston, and tutor for Kiwanis Next Start reading program. For years, Mrs. Lokey was an active participant at her church, St. Michael and All Angels Episcopal Church, Anniston, where she served in several roles.

Louise Williams Lokey was a joyful person, who spread joy everywhere she went.
