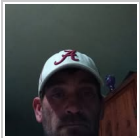
Pearl is preceded in death by her brother, Daniel Hodge, and grandfather, Virgil Cotton.

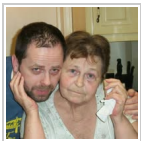
