Mr. Higgins played cards professionally and was very successful but at the same time, he had a giving heart and would help those who needed it.

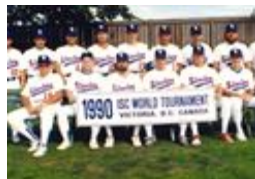
