September 17, 1951 - June 25, 2022

Sue Glisan, born in Livingston, Montana on September 17, 1951, died suddenly of a heart attack on Saturday morning, June 25, 2022. She was preceded in death by her father, Paul J. Boring, mother, Dorris B. Boring, and brother, Daniel Boring.

Sue graduated from high school in Livingston, Montana, and joined the United States Army in 1973. Her perseverance, and 'I can do it myself' spirit enabled her to become the Army's first woman helicopter gunship pilot! After serving five years, including a deployment to the DMZ in South Korea, she was honorably discharged. Sue was inducted in the Women in Aviation's Hall of Fame in 2020 as one of the U.S. Army's First Women Rotary Wing Aviators.

She received a Bachelor of Science degree in accounting, with highest honors, at Jacksonville State University, and became a contractor at several nuclear power plants around the country.

While living and working at Oconee Nuclear Power Plant in Seneca, SC, she came to a faith in Jesus Christ as her Savior and Lord, attending College Street Baptist Church. Her strong faith and caring heart soon influenced many who knew her.

After retiring, she returned to Anniston, Alabama, where she found Parker

Memorial Baptist Church as her place to serve the Lord and grow in her faith. She'll be long remembered for her generosity in many ways, always ready to share her talents and meet the needs of others (oftentimes anonymously). Her passing is heaven's gain but will leave a huge void in the lives of her many friends left behind.

Sue's Celebration of Life and Memorial will be held on Sunday, July 10, at 2:00 pm at Parker Memorial Baptist Church in Anniston. Sue would treasure remembrances made to Parker Memorial Baptist Church.
