Tyler G. Tychon passed away on Friday, September 5th, 2025. He was 61 years old.

Tyler is survived by his parents, Gordon Michael Tychon and Valerie Jean Tychon Parsons; brothers, Trevor Michael Tychon (Jana), "Timothy" John Tychon, Terry Gordon Tychon (Marisa); nephews, Jayden and Justin Tychon.

Tyler was born in Calgary Alberta, Canada to Gordon and Valerie Tychon. Prior to finally settling in Alabama, Tyler lived in various places around the world including Nairobi, Kenya; Long Island, New York; Houston, Texas and the San Francisco Bay area. Playing peewee hockey as a child sparked a life-long love of the sport and he became a devoted NHL San Jose Sharks fan. In addition to hockey, Tyler enjoyed motorcycles and fishing. He owned several motorcycles and often took long, exploratory rides. As a fishing enthusiast, he would often bring a rod and reel with him to scout new locations and go on relaxing excursions. Professionally, Tyler was proud to be the first employee of a data center technology company, to work doing fiber optic installations for a telecommunications company, and to be a maintenance lead for a Six Flag's amusement park in California. Beyond Tyler's hobbies and work-life, his great passion was helping others on their path to sobriety as he had been helped as a younger man. Tyler was very committed to the Alcoholics Anonymous organization and devoted significant time to supporting the members of that

community through attending and often speaking at or leading meetings.
