Vicky was born September 10, 1963, in Anniston, Alabama, to James "Bo" and Elizabeth "Liz" Hearn. Vicky attended Saks High School where she excelled in sports , especially softball. Later she would spend many hours as a Band Booster supporting the Wildcats during her daughter's high school years.

Early in her life Vicky worked at and later managed a new restaurant in Anniston named Sonic. Because of this early training her speed in meal prep was lightning fast. She had definite ideas of how food should be prepared, knew exactly what she wanted, and how she wanted it... as the crew at the Anniston Waffle House will attest to. Their breakfast crew greeted her each morning with her earned title of "Picky Vicky" which would cause her to smile that little smirk of a grin, throw up her hand in a slight wave, and still demand her eggs over medium. These same restaurant skills came in handy as she hosted numerous Family Get Togethers and also gave years of service to Sunny Eve Baptist Church as the Hospitality chair for the church fellowship

hall. She and her team of SEBC Ladies would develop the most beautiful and artistic themes for the holiday celebrations, especially Christmas. Her menus were fun and her food was always delicious. At any church event Vicky would always be seen in the SEBC kitchen helping to ensure that everyone was fed and that the place was spotless. She was a valuable and dedicated member of Sunny Eve Baptist Church.

She was later employed in the textile business working many years at Chalk line and Anniston Sportswear before her early retirement. On any assembly line, Vic was known for her speed and strength.

Vicky had a love of sports and games; whether it was cheering for her Alabama Crimson Tide, gaming (first Pac Man, later Monopoly) , playing softball, or volleyball, she was passionate about winning. As an adult Vicky played co-ed softball and co-ed volleyball. Her physical talents, amazing grasp of numbers, and her competitive spirit made her a formidable opponent and a valued team member.

Vicky started officiating volleyball in 2002 and she fell in love with working with all of her “Volleyball Kids” as she liked to refer to them. She would officiate with East Alabama Volleyball Officials Association #601 for over 23 years. Her last game to call was at the Donoho Classic Tournament. She was considered the best R-2 Official ever.

Vicky entered the presence of her Savior on Sunday, September 21, 2025, at Princeton Hospital in Birmingham, Alabama while surrounded by her beloved family and a host of friends.
